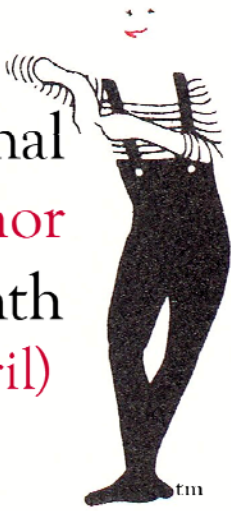


Sense of Humor Locator
